
## The Basket Block

Throughout history, in all cultures, the basket has had a daily presence in a women's life. It is no wonder that the basket block has been used in quilt patterns over the centuries. The varieties of ways we use baskets in quilts are endless; from baskets with handles to those without, appliqued with fruits and flowers or various pieced basket patterns... Although we no longer use baskets in our everyday lives to carry vegetables, flowers, and other goods, we still use them as containers for gifts, decorative arrangements and to piece into our beloved quilts.

Block 2 in the mystery quilt is a basket block...Use the instructions below, or create your favorite 9.5 inch basket block.

## **Basket/Cake Stand**



## Choose your fabrics

- Light fabric for background (1)
- Dark fabric for the stand (2)
- Medium or dark for the points (3)
- Light or medium (4)

This block is made out of half square triangles

To cut proper right triangles that include the  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance, cut the squares 7/8" larger than the finished size

Cut 1 5 3/8" x 5 3/8" square from each of fabrics 2 and 4 Draw a diagonal line down centre and sew on each side of the line. Cut on the line to get two 5" x 5" half square triangles.

Cut the following 3 1/8" x 3 1/8" squares .....Three from fabric 1 (light), one of fabric 2 (dark) and two of fabric 3 (points)

Assemble four half square units of fabric 1 and 3, and two half square units of fabric 1 and 2. Size should be  $2 \frac{3}{4}$ " x  $2 \frac{3}{4}$ ".

Cut 6 squares of fabric 1 (light) 2 ¾" x2 ¾ "

Assemble per the block diagram. 9.5 inch block
